March & Our Lenten Journey

Jonah 4:8-11

8 As the sun was rising, God appointed a scorching east wind. The sun beat down so much on Jonah's head that he almost fainted, and he wanted to die. He said, "It's better for me to die than to live." 9 Then God asked Jonah, "Is it right for you to be angry about the plant?" "Yes," he replied. "It is right. I'm angry enough to die!" 10 So the Lord said, "You cared about the plant, which you did not labor over and did not grow. It appeared in a night and perished in a night. 11 Should I not care about the great city of Nineveh, which has more than 120,000 people who cannot distinguish between their right and their left, as well as many animals?"

Jonah knew what would happen when he went to Nineveh. He knew what God would do if the people repented. He dreaded his assignment so much that he attempted to travel to the ends of the earth (Tarshish) to escape God's directive for him.

The Romans knew what would happen when they executed Jesus of Nazareth. This so-called "King of the Jews" who was flogged, crucified, and buried would be forgotten like all those who preceded Him. So too did the chief priests and the scribes know what would happen when they set this course of events in motion. It would secure their world, their high priestly positions, and at the end of the day, it would be just another failed messiah who couldn't save the Jews from oppression.

The women, who go to the tomb on the third day to anoint Jesus' lifeless body, they too bought into the usual expectations of one who has been crucified. The angels' admonishment of the terrified women at the tomb--"Why do you look for the living, among the dead?" (Luke 24:5), is similar to the one God gives Jonah at the end of the book, where God comically reminds the angry prophet just how many children and animals there are in Nineveh.

Should I not care about the great city of Nineveh, which has more than 120,000 people who cannot distinguish between their right and their left, as well as many animals?"

This Lenten season, which Ash Wednesday kicks off on March 6, is a reminder to Jonah, the women at the tomb, and to us—that our God promises release to the captives, sight to the blind, freedom to the oppressed, and eternity to us and to all of His creation!

May we travel with our risen Lord for 40 days, beginning March 6, that leads us to the glory of resurrection Sunday!

Who is Annie?

nnie Armstrong was never A concerned with what the world expected.

Annie was born in Baltimore 1850, during a time when women were not expected to be leaders, speak up or to be visionaries, but Annie didn't conform to the standards. She served, challenged churches to action and rallied support for missionaries like Lottie Moon, a China missionary, who had served for 11 years without a furlough. She advocated for Native American and impoverished mountain people and gained support for the first African American female missionaries. She refused a salary because she would never give to the Lord "that which costs me nothing" (2 Sam. 24:24).

Ultimately, Annie was recognized as a national Southern Baptist trailblazer renowned for visionary mission leadership. That changed a lot of people's lives along the way and is still doing it today through the **Annie Armstrong** Easter Offering with \$1 billion given today and over 5,000 missionaries that have support from the gifts that are given. All gifts are 100% in support of the missionaries and missions that are local and around our country. Our goal for First Baptist this year is \$2,000. Help support our local missionaries through this offering in which one woman decided to change the world's view about what was expected from women.
