I know it can be difficult to keep coming up with fresh ideas to keep your children engaged with everything from school lessons to family worship. I was reading this article by Sandy Swartzentruber and thought she had some amazing insights on how to make family worship time fresh, exciting, and comforting for your little ones. I hope you find it as helpful as I did.

## Jesus Cooks Breakfast: Ideas for Sharing Sensory Bible Stories with Kids

It just might be my favorite Bible story of all.

Looking for a bit of normalcy after the emotional rollercoaster of Jesus' death and resurrection, Peter decides to go fishing. A few other disciples join him. They fish all night, flinging out their wet, heavy nets over and over.

Nothing. Still nothing. Not. One. Fish.
Early in the morning, they're tired, hungry, and discouraged. As they near shore, they see-Jesus! But what's he doing? He's not standing there looking holy with his hands raised in benediction. The risen Lord is bending over a fire frying up some crispy fish fillets, tending them carefully so as not to burn them. And to top it all off, he provides Peter and company with their own catch in nets full to bursting.
The sensory elements of that story are SO compelling. The sight of Jesus in the early morning light, the sound of the waves lapping the shore, the smell of frying fish sizzling over a smoky fire, the welcome taste of food after a long hungry night, and, I like to think, the feeling of Jesus hugging his friends as they climb out of the boat.

Exploring the Bible with All Five Senses

The Bible is full of sense-tingling stories like that one. With just a little imagination, you can weave sensory elements into the exploration of any Bible story, whether you're at home, at church, or any other place. Here are some ideas.

## NOSE

- When you read a Bible story, make a "smell list" with kids. Write down all the things you might smell if you were there while the story was happening.
- Go on a smell hunt. Read a Bible story and look for things around the house or your church that smell like things on your smell list.
- Light a scented candle or some incense each time you read a Bible story together, so kids associate a special smell with the "special revelation" of God's Word.


## MOUTH

- Use food as a prop. For example, put Cheerios on the floor to represent manna and let your kids gather and eat them while you read the Exodus story (might wanna clean that floor first, just saying.)

In these uncertain times, some things remain steadfast, and I am reminded of this with "Jesus Is the Sweetest Name I Know" by Lela B. Long. Robert J. Morgan (THEN SINGS MY SOUL, 2011 edition, pg. 575), retells the story of Dr. P.W. Philpot, then-pastor of Moody Church in Chicago, meeting Ms. Long after he "received a frantic phone call about a young lady who was very ill...and appeared to not have long to live." He went to her and "spent time talking with her and was eventually able to lead her to the Lord. Her family thanked [him] and assured [him] they would keep [him] informed as to her progress." Sadly, he never heard anything more about her.

Years later, Dr. Philpot became a pastor in California. "One Sunday afternoon after the service, who should come to see me but the three people I had met at the hotel in Chicago those many years before. They had seen a church ad in the paper and had come to thank me for my help and to apologize for not advising me sooner of what had transpired. The young lady especially thanked me for leading her to Christ and testified to the fact that her life had been wonderfully changed." God had gifted her with a talent for music. She gave him a manuscript, written for him "in remembrance of the day that [he] introduced [her] to the most wonderful person [she had] ever known."

I will let you know if they are still collecting school supplies for this year, as school is looking different for a lot of students this year.
Food for thought: In an article from June's Missions Mosaic entitled "A Sign for the Times," Sandy Wisdom-Martin, executive director of the National WMU, tells a story about COVID-19 canceling many events and giving her time to go through boxes of stuff she had stored away. She writes about finding a sign that says 'stop, go ahead, calm down, and quiet.' She thought her daughter would love to use this as she is preparing to be an elementary school teacher. But her daughter gave it back to her stating, "under the current circumstances this may be more helpful in your job." As her article went to print, Sandy stated the COVID-19 tsunami had hit full force with no clear end in sight. She is bombarded with demands for decisions that she feels illequipped to make. Some times she wants to hold up the "stop" sign to give herself a momentary break. Other times she needs to point the "calm down" sign at herself to remind her to speak peace in the lives of those she guides, stating, "I cannot lead during a crisis with a posture of nervousness." The "quiet" signal remind her to still her heart before the Father and center on His will. The "go ahead" signal has limited use in these days of uncertainty but is used with less bravado and more quiet confidence in His leading. She mentioned Samuel from the Bible and his mother who displayed a quiet confidence in God. Because of her persistent prayers and wholehearted surrender to His will, God granted the desires of her heart. Her steadfast faithfulness changed the course of a nation. So when you feel uncertain, turn to God's Word for a "sign" from Him!
