A Call for Civility...

Civility seems to be slipping away from our culture at warp speed, this is something we need now more than ever. Mob mentality is marching across our land and

the sanctity of human lives is left in its wake. This is a time that we, the church, need to raise our voice to help heal our nation and help all people to see one another as valued in the eyes of our God.

The early church faced much opposition and mob mentality was prevalent just as much as it is today. So, what we are experiencing is not new, and the body of Christ, as outlined in the book of Acts, can help us see our way forward during this difficult time that we face in today's climate.

From Dr. Jim Denison on this issue:

"The early church leaders were Galileans; we would call them "country folk." Not one of them was from Jerusalem or any city you'd recognize. The vast majority were foreigners, from the fifteen nations Luke listed earlier (Acts 2:9–11).

Religious leaders in Jerusalem called them "uneducated, common men" (Acts 4:13), since they did not have the rabbinic schooling and background of the Jewish leaders. Yet in just thirty years their movement spread from Jerusalem to Rome, and from 120 to multiplied thousands, and soon millions. They became the mightiest and largest religious movement in human history.

What explains their incredible success? What did they have which we need?"

There were certain characteristics that defined the early church and how they persevered during the time they faced so much opposition. Listed below are things we can learn from them to help one another to value all life as sacred and of equal worth.

1. They devoted themselves to the teaching of the disciples and relying on the word of God as truth

And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching, to the fellowship, to the breaking of bread, and to the prayers. Acts 2:42

2. They were passionate and devoted to their fellowship with one another

Now all the believers were together and held all things in common. They sold their possessions and property and distributed the proceeds to all, as anyone had a need. Acts 2:44-45

3. They were passionate about the "breaking of the bread" with one another

"Every day they devoted themselves to meeting together in the temple complex, and broke bread from house to house. They ate their food with a joyful and humble attitude." Acts 2:46

4. They were passionate about their prayers, and praying with and for one another

"And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching, to the fellowship, to the breaking of bread, and to the prayers." Acts 2:42

At the end of this chapter we can see the result of how God blessed them for their faithfulness and devotion to Him and to one another as we read Acts 2:47:

"..praising God and having favor with all the people. And every day the Lord added to them those who were being saved."

Should I get involved?

It's a question many of us ask ourselves, and yet most of us know the answer but allow ourselves to reason it away. The reasoning seems sound. We tell ourselves we are too busy, too young, too old, or we're not qualified for that kind of ministry involvement. Some are still waiting for God to give them a sign that lights up and blinks 'this is where I want you to serve.' Of course, I am joking to some degree, but a great many people seem to think someone else will do it and yet the openings in church ministries remain vacant and constant invites go unanswered.

In a recent blog post by Dr. Jim Dennison, he reported findings from a recent study that should wake all of us up. The study revealed that "A recent study reported that only 2 percent of America's millennials hold a biblical worldview. Among Gen X (thirty-seven to fifty-five years of age), only 5 percent subscribe to such a worldview. Only an estimated 9 percent of adults over fifty-six hold a biblical worldview." This suggests that with each generation the Christian worldview is losing traction. How do we, the church, make a difference? The answer is clear. Get involved.

As we continue to return to in-person worship, we are going to need Sunday school leaders and assistants for all ages. We need committed Christian adults to mentor young people and build the all-important relationships that will teach them that church is a safe place where they will experience the love, grace and mercy of our Heavenly Father. It is absolutely crucial that young people experience the lifegiving salvation of Christ and the bond of Christian community if they are to have any chance of weathering the temptations of this world and resisting Satan's call to leave their faith behind.


