ver the last 20 years or so, we have seen a subtle shift from wishing others a "Merry Christmas" to "Happy Holidays." This has been the shift moving away from Christianity in society and culture to more of a secular feel. Originally, during this time of year, it was considered to be a pagan holiday and celebrated as a winter solstice.

"Cultures around the Mediterranean and across Europe observed feasts on or around December 25th, marking the winter solstice. The Jews had a festival of lights. Germans had a yule festival. Celtic legends connected the solstice with Balder, the Scandinavian sun god who was struck down by a mistletoe arrow. At the pagan festival of Saturnalia, Romans feasted and gave gifts to the poor. Drinking was closely connected with these pagan feasts. At some point, a Christian bishop may have adopted the day to keep his people from indulging in the old pagan festival."

The first Christmas is recorded in 336 AD as a celebration of the nativity and dating it in December, 9 months from when Christ was thought to originally have been born. Whatever the ins and outs of Christmas, we are still unwrapping the gift of God's Son--and what an incentive to generosity and joy that gift is!

Dr. Jim Denison states,

"Many will do the same with Christmas. I was walking in my neighborhood yesterday and passed a yard sign for the company that installed Christmas lights on the roofline of the house. I noticed that the sign advertised "Holiday Lights," not Christmas Lights. We will hear "Happy Holidays" rather than "Merry Christmas" over the coming weeks.

This is not primarily because we don't want to offend our Jewish, Muslim, or Hindu neighbors, since they make up

less than 6 percent

of all Americans. It is because secular people want the experience of Christmas without the reality of Christ.

They want to enjoy the birthday party while ignoring the guest of honor.

Our culture cuts the flowers off at the roots and then wonders why they die."

Because of this incredible gift we celebrate during this time of year, I would like to encourage all of us to wish one another a "Merry Christmas" rather than watering it down to just a "Happy Holiday". May we never forsake why we celebrate this time of year!

A WORD FROM THE MUSIC MINISTER

"But you, Bethlehem Ephrathah, though you are little among the thousands of Judah, yet out of you shall come forth to Me the One to be Ruler in Israel, whose goings forth are from of old, from everlasting." Micah 5:2 NKJV

Phillip Brooks is considered "one of America's greatest preachers." Robert J. Morgan, in his 2011 edition of THEN SINGS MY SOUL (pg. 277), tells the story of the Episcopalian minister and his organist Lewis Redner. When Brooks was 30 years old, he "visited the Holy Land, [and] on December 24, 1865, traveling by horseback from Jerusalem, he attended a five-hour Christmas Eve service at the Church of the Nativity in Bethlehem." He later said that he "was deeply moved. ...standing in the old church in Bethlehem close to the spot where Jesus was born, when the whole church was ringing hour after hour with splendid hymns of praise to God" In 1867, when "he wanted to compose an original Christmas hymn for the children to sing during their annual program, [he recalled] his magical night in Bethlehem [and] wrote a little hymn of five stanzas and handed the words to his organist saying, 'Lewis, why not write a new tune for my poem. If it is a good tune. I will name it ST. LEWIS after you.' " Mr. Redner "struggled with his assignment, complaining of no inspiration. Finally, on the night before the Christmas program, he awoke with the music ringing in his soul." The first stanza of "O Little Town of Bethlehem" is very familiar, but ponder on the fourth stanza, which is rarely sung. (Brooks did name the tune after Redner, but he "changed to spelling to ST. LOUIS so as not to embarrass him.")

O little town of Bethlehem, How still we see thee lie! Above thy deep and dreamless sleep The silent stars go by; Yet in thy dark streets shineth The everlasting Light; The hopes and fears of all the years Are met in thee tonight.

Where children pure and happy Pray to the blessed Child, Where misery cries out to Thee, Son of the mother mild; Where charity stands watching And faith holds wide the door; The dark night wakes, the glory breaks, And Christmas comes once more.

November 29 through December 6th is the Week of Prayer for International Missions, and this month we focus on the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering. Lottie was 32 years old when she was called to the mission field in China. She had left behind a-turned-down marriage proposal, her job, family and friends to follow God's lead. The path she took was not normal for an educated women from a wealthy southern family. For thirty-nine years Lottie serve in Tengchow and P'ingtu. The people rejected and feared her, but she refused to leave and baked cookies to get people to come to her house. She changed her customs and learned the people's language. She didn't just serve the people of China, she identified with their with customs and culture and was eventually accepted by many, even having some accept Christ as their Savior.

Our goal for the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering this year is \$3,000, with 100% of this going directly to sustain the international missionaries and their work.


