Hey FBC Family!

I pray you are all happy, healthy and enjoying all that Jesus has blessed us with! It can be easy sometimes to lose track of our blessings in the face of great difficulty. This month I wanted to talk about creating a safe place, the church, where kids and adults alike can explore the reality of faith in Jesus as well as the confusion the world throws at us all.

I will never forget the first time I went to my mom to ask what a certain explicit term meant. The moment the word left my lips I could see the look of shock and bewilderment that took up residence on her face! I remember thinking, "oh boy, grounded again and I don't even know why this time!!" She exclaimed, "Where on earth did you hear that?" I mumbled that I had heard it at school. Another boy had called me a name and I didn't know what it meant. Much to her credit, my mom took a breath, explained to me what the word meant and that I should never, ever use it.

Let's face it. Everyone has questions, especially kids. Have we done the work to create a safe space where these questions can be asked without fear of judgement or embarrassment? The old adage, it takes a village is especially true in the church. Whether we realize it or not, our kids and visitors are looking to all of us for cues on what it means to be a Christian. Also, it's up to the entirety of the church body to disciple others. It's OUR mutual calling! The problem with discipleship is that it is a relationship. Relationships are two-way and relationships require trust.

So, how do we create such a space? First and foremost, I believe it starts with our relationship with Jesus and praying for the opportunities and wisdom to both be a disciple and offer discipleship to others. Second, we have to be willing to do the work of building trust in others. The old saying, people don't care what you know until they know you care, really fits here. We have to earn the right to pour into the lives of others. This is especially true with youth. Third, realize that we don't need to have all of the answers, to disciple another person. We only need to be willing to go on the journey with them. Help them find answers to issues that are outside of our knowledge or comfort

zone. Help plug them with people who can meet their needs and follow up.

Lastly, listen as much or more than you speak and try not to let your face betray your intentions. If you allow yourself to appear shocked or disgusted by a question asked in trust, you may lose the opportunity before you've had a chance to show Jesus to that person. I find most people have some insecurities and often feel like something is wrong with them, especially in a stressful situation like asking for advice or even what a certain four-letter word means. If we allow ourselves to look shocked or disgusted, it's often taken as confirmation of what the asker fears most: there is something wrong with me

In Jesus' name, let's be a safe harbor in the storms of life for all who are seeking.

A WORD FROM THE MUSIC MINISTER

"And He, bearing His cross, went to a place call the Place of a Skull, which is call in Hebrew, Golgotha." John 19:17 NKJV

Most people, even though they are not music scholars, have heard of Fanny Crosby. She is the author of thousands of hymns, many of which we sing today. Because the season of Lent begins this month, I was studying the stories of hymns and was touched by "Near the Cross" in Robert J. Morgan's THEN SINGS MY SOUL (2011 edition, pg. 295). Many will remember that Fanny Crosby was blinded as a child but overcame this difficulty and eventually became a teacher for the blind in New York City. She wrote "remarkable poetry [that] brought widespread acclaim to the school, and she frequently recited her work for visiting dignitaries." But it was in 1850 while attending "a revival meeting at New York's Thirtieth Street Methodist Church [that she] something was missing in her life. On two occasions during this meeting, she prayed with counselors, but without gaining assurance of a personal relationship with God. On November 20, 1850, as the altar call was given, Fanny went forward and found Christ as her Savior. The congregation was singing Isaac Watts' great hymn "At the Cross."

"Shortly thereafter, Fanny turned her poetic skills to hymn writing, and many of her songs focused on the theme of the cross." "Near the Cross" was written "after a Cincinnati businessman, William Doane, gave her a melody he had written. She listened to it and felt it said 'Jesus keep me near the cross.' She promptly wrote the [following] words." Let us reflect on these verses during Lent:

Jesus, keep me near the cross, There a precious fountain, Free to all, a healing stream, Flows from Calv'ry's mountain.

In the cross, in the cross Be my glory ever, Till my ransomed soul shall find Rest beyond the river.

Near the cross! O Lamb of God, Bring its scenes before me; Help me walk from day to day With its shadows o'er me.
