Startling Implications of the Resurrection...

Christianity stands or falls on the resurrection of Jesus Christ. When Matthew records for us the events of chapter 28, he is, through the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, making claims that change the world. We'll look at three implications concerning the authority of Christ based on the resurrection.

1. He has authority over life and death

If Jesus didn't rise from the dead, then we don't have to worry about a thing He said, because it was a lie. But if Jesus rose from the dead, then we must accept everything He said, for His authority is absolute. Jesus closes this chapter and the Gospel as a whole by claiming, "All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth" (v. 18). Jesus' absolute authority based on the resurrection means that He has authority over life and death. Shortly before His own death, Jesus told His disciples the following:

No one takes it [My life] from Me, but I lay it down on My own. I have the right to lay it down, and I have the right to take it up again.

That's an astounding statement. None of us decides when we will come into this world, and when we die, none of us has the power to say, "I'm coming back to life." But that's precisely what Jesus did, and if He did rise from the dead, then He has absolute authority over life and death.

2. He has authority over sin and Satan

If Jesus rose from the dead, then we must also admit that He has authority over sin and Satan. All men die because they sin, for death is the payment for sin. However, Jesus is one man in all of history who died without sinning; so why did He die? Jesus died for our sins, in our place. After His death, Jesus rose from the grave, not only in victory over death, but in victory over sin.

3. He has authority over you and me

The fact that Jesus has authority over life and death, as well as over sin and Satan, leads to one unavoidable conclusion: He has authority over you and me. Paul speaks to this reality in Romans 10:9-13, what we might refer to as the foundational confession of Christianity:

If you confess with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. One believes with the heart, resulting in righteousness, and one confesses with the mouth, resulting in salvation. Now the Scripture says, Everyone who believes on Him will not be put to shame, for there is no distinction between Jew and Greek, since the same Lord of all is rich to all who call on Him. For everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.

First, it means He reigns over us supremely. Many times Christians say, "I've decided to make Jesus the Lord of my life." I hate to break it to you, but you didn't have a choice

in the matter. Jesus is Lord over your life. Scripture says that one day every knee will bow and every tongue will confess that Jesus Christ is Lord. The question is not whether or not Jesus is Lord; the question is, "Will you submit to Him as Lord now or when it is too late?"

Second, He loves us deeply. Remember that the purpose of the resurrection is grounded in Christ's love for us. God sent His Son to pay the price for our sin, and the resurrection lets us know that our hope of salvation is not some made -up story, some fanciful myth. The resurrection of Jesus validates everything He said, taught, and told us He came to do. Paul speaks of the Son of God who "loved me and gave Himself for me." Believers should rejoice in Jesus' love demonstrated in both His cross and His resurrection.

Third, Christ's authority over us means that He will judge us eternally. Jesus speaks of His role as judge in John 5:21-23. For all who believe in Christ, the truth of Christ's judgment is good news. It's good news because you can be saved from eternal judgment if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead (Romans 10:9).

Christ's role as judge is also good news because the resurrection reminds us that this world is not all there is. If our only expectations are for this life, then we have no hope in the face of tragedy in this world. Furthermore, Christ's judgment means our efforts for justice in this world become meaningful.

This Easter I want to ask you, "do your children really understand the importance of the Easter story?" That is, beyond the basic Sunday school understanding that most of us have grown up with? This world, and even our nation is fast becoming more and more intolerant of Christians and our beliefs. Today it's more important than ever that your kids truly understand how crucial the events of Holy Week are to our Christian faith.

In an article from last year, Natasha Crain explains this in details that will help equip us to teach children what they need to know about Easter to withstand the attacks they are certain to face regarding their faith. The following is an excerpt, and I have included the web address so you can read the entire article. I hope you will make this part of your Holy Week observance this year.

"Despite the fact that the resurrection is foundational to Christianity, kids often have an underdeveloped "Sunday school" understanding of how Easter fits into the bigger picture of their faith. They may know that on Easter we celebrate that Jesus was raised from the dead, but they may not be able to articulate why it really matters, or why there's good reason to believe it happened. This limited understanding leaves them unprepared for the faith challenges they'll face in today's world. In some cases, those challenges will even come from people who say they are Christian but reject the resurrection as a real event.

To better equip kids for these challenges—and ultimately deepen their faith—we can teach them how the resurrection fits into its wider biblical context. That bigger picture helps give our kids a confident faith when they're surrounded by a culture that sees their beliefs as ridiculous."

A Word **FROM** THE MUSIC MINISTER

We are grateful, however, for those who have been willing to serve during this Lenten and Easter season "pandemic style." To God alone be the glory!

In preparing for this article, I once again turned to Robert J. Morgan's THEN SINGS MY SOUL (2011 edition, pg. 79). He tells the story of a man named Joseph Williams who once heard Charles Wesley preach. "I found him standing on table-board...surrounded by, I guess, more than a thousand people, some of them fashionable persons, but most of the lower rank of mankind. He preached about half an hour in such a manner as I have scarce ever heard any man preach.... I think I never heard any man labor so earnestly to convince his hearers they were all by nature in a sinful, lost, undone, state; that notwithstanding, there was a possibility of their salvation, through faith in Christ...All this he backed up with many texts of Scripture, which he explained and illustrated, and then by a variety of the most forcible motives, arguments, and expostulation, did he invite, allure, quicken, and labor, if it were possible, to compel all, and every of his hearers, to believe in Christ for salvation." Many of Charles Wesley's hymns are still sung around the globe each and every Sunday, but "perhaps his most exuberant anthem is the one he simply called 'Hymn for Easter Day,' published in 1739." We know it as "Christ the Lord Is Risen Today."

Christ the Lord is risen today, Alleluia! Sons of men and angels say: Alleluia! Raise your joys and triumphs high, Alleluia! Sing, ye heavens, and earth, reply: Alleluia!

Lives again our glorious King, Alleluia! Where, O death, is now thy sting? Alleluia! Dying once He all doth save, Alleluia! Where thy victory, O grave? Alleluia!

Love's redeeming work is done, Alleluia! Fought the fight, the battle won, Alleluia! Death in vain forbids Him rise, Alleluia! Christ hath opened paradise, Alleluia!


