hands. I asked why? They responded that it was of value, it was worth \$5 and they could buy something with it or save it. I then crumpled the bill in my hand and asked them again if they wanted it. Again, they said yes, it was worth \$5, even in a crumpled, wrinkled state.

I then took the \$5 dollar bill and placed it beneath my feet and trampled it underfoot. It was now dirty, filthy, wrinkled and in really bad shape. I asked a third time, who would like this \$5 dollar bill. All the hands still went up and they said to me that no matter what condition the \$5 dollar bill was in, it has not lost its value.

I then said to them, that is exactly how your heavenly Father feels about you. Your worth to God has always been the same from before you were born and will be till the day you die. No matter how much you have been wrinkled, dirty, filthy, disrespectful, disobedient, etc... your Father in heaven loves you just the same."

In order to experience that love, you must place your trust and faith in His Son Jesus Christ. Your value will never change or be diminished in your Father's eyes, regardless of the choices you make. He loves you that much and He showed you that love when He died on the cross... for you!

Each day Pastor Kevin made sure we were fueled up with wonderful meals. My favorite was the shrimp and rice! We started our days with group devotions and it was wonderful to share that time together. In the evenings we gathered around the fire pit for s'mores and fellowship. It was a great way to share about our day. If you ever have the opportunity to take a trip to Miss Mary's, I highly recommend it! If you want an extra special blessing, go as a chaperone with a bunch of kids!!

A WORD FROM THE MUSIC MINISTER

"But our citizenship is in heaven. And we eagerly await a Savior from there, the Lord Jesus Christ." Philippians 3:20 NIV

This is the month we sing favorites like "America the Beautiful" and "My Country, 'Tis of Thee." Many of us will hang flags and enjoy cookouts with family and friends. Our hearts will be stirred with patriotism and gratefulness as we celebrate the birth of our nation.

This is the story of our national anthem from Robert J. Morgan's THEN SINGS MY SOUL (2011 edition, pg. 147). This is about Francis Scott Key, an attorney and evangelical Christian, who "undertook a hostage-recovery mission at the request of the President of the United States. He was seeking the release of a prominent physician, Dr. Beanes, who had been taken captive. During the assignment he was detained by enemy troops and forced to watch a brutal assault on the eastern "Toward the morning of seaboard.". September 14, 1814, when it became clear that American forces had withstood the 25-hour bombardment, he penned [a] hymn, scribbling it on the back of an envelope." Once back in Baltimore, Francis wrote it out "in fuller form," and then his brother-in-law had the hymn printed and distributed. "One copy landed in the hands of an unknown musician who adapted it to the tune 'To Anacreon in Heaven.'" And thus our national anthem was born!

Oh say, can you see by the dawn's early light,

What so proudly we hailed at the twilight's last gleaming, Whose broad stripes and bright stars,

through the perilous fight, O'er the ramparts we watched, were so gallantly streaming?

And the rockets' red glare, the bombs bursting in air,

Gave proof thro' the night that our flag was still there.

Oh say, does that star-spangled banner yet wave O'er the land of the free and the home

of the brave?
Oh thus be it ever, when freemen shall

stand
Between their loved homes and the war's desolation;

Blest with vict'ry and peace, may the heav'n-rescued land


