### WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO FOLLOW JESUS?

In Matthew 10, He talks about things we'll go through when we really follow him. Jesus is telling his disciples that they will go through afflictions. He tells them, if they want to follow Me they will face opposition and difficulties.

MATTHEW 10:34 DO NOT THINK THAT I HAVE COME TO BRING PEACE ON EARTH: I HAVE NOT COME TO BRING PEACE, BUT A SWORD. WE READ SOMETHING DIFFERENT about the Jesus we know in this verse, THE LOVING JESUS, PRINCE OF PEACE, WHO SAYS LOVE OUR ENEMIES AND LOVE YOUR NEIGHBOR. HE SEEMS TO BE DIFFERENT HERE. WE ARE SURPRISED THAT HE SAYS,  $\boldsymbol{I}$  DID NOT COME TO BRING PEACE BUT A SWORD AND THIS CAN CONFUSE US. SO HOW IS THIS APPARENT CONTRADICTION? JESUS CAME TO BRING PEACE, BUT PEACE WITH GOD AND PEACE ON A PERSONAL LEVEL THAT passes all understanding. But in the SENSE OF THIS VERSE AND ITS CONTEXT, THAT IS, WHAT HAS BEEN WRITTEN OR HAS BEEN READ BEFORE ABOUT THE DIFFICULTIES THE DISCIPLES WOULD GO THROUGH. HE SAID, "DO NOT THINK THAT I HAVE COME TO BRING PEACE ON EARTH BUT A SWORD." HE TALKS ABOUT THE GOSPEL, THE SPEAKING OF JESUS, THAT JESUS HIMSELF CAN CREATE BARRIERS, DIVISIONS, CONFLICTS.
THAT IS WHY HE SAYS I DID NOT COME TO BRING PEACE BUT A SWORD. HIS MESSAGE AND CHRIST HIMSELF CAN BE DIVISIVE. So, HE TELLS US THAT WE WILL SEE OR EXPERIENCE THIS DIVISION EVEN AMONG THE PEOPLE WE LOVE THE MOST, THAT IS, IN OUR OWN FAMILY.

SO, WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO FOLLOW JESUS? FOLLOWING JESUS HAS A PRICE, AND WHEN WE SEE THIS, WE FEEL LIKE WE CAN'T MEET THE STANDARD OR WE FEEL LIKE FAILURES. BUT WE ARE NOT ALONE. IN OUR OWN STRENGTH WE WILL NOT BE ABLE TO MEET THESE EXPECTATIONS. PETER FAILED, HE DENIED HIM THREE TIMES, THE DISCIPLES ARGUED OVER WHO WILL BE THE GREATEST IN HIS KINGDOM AND THEY SHOWED PRIDE. WE CONSTANTLY FAIL AND IN OUR OWN STRENGTH WE CANNOT, BUT IN CHRIST AND THE POWER OF THE HOLY SPIRIT WE CAN FOLLOW HIM LIKE HE WANTS US TO DO.

This month the first message was "What path or race do you choose?" Do you choose to "run in the path of God's commands" (Psalm 119:32). Do you choose Jesus and the crown of righteousness—"I have finished the race, I have kept the faith. And now the prize awaits me—the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous Judge, will give me on the day of His return. 2Timothy 4:7-8.

Or, do you choose to run an aimless race where "all is vanity and there is futile grasping and chasing the wind" Ecclesiastes 1:14, a path with no purpose but filled with destruction and death?

Our prayer is for all to be believers and followers of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, the King of kings, the light of the world!

The second message was on our risen Savior!

Isiah 53: He was despised and rejected—a man of sorrows, acquainted with deepest grief. We turned our backs on Him and looked the other way. He was despised, and we did not care. Yet it was our weak-nesses He carried; it was our sorrows that weighed Him down. And we thought His troubles were a pun-ishment from God, a punishment for His own sins! But He was pierced for our rebellion, crushed for our sins. He was beaten so we could be whole. He was whipped so we could be healed. All of us, like sheep, have strayed away. We have left God's paths to follow our own. Yet the Lord laid on Him the sins of us all. He was oppressed and treated harshly, yet He never said a word. He was led like a lamb to the slaughter. And as a sheep is silent before the shearers, He did not open His mouth. Unjustly condemned, He was led away. No one cared that He died without descendants, that His life was cut short in midstream. But He was struck down for the rebellion of my people. He had done no wrong and had never deceived anyone. But He was buried like a criminal; He was put in a rich man's grave. But it was the Lord's good plan to crush Him and cause Him grief. Yet when His life is made an offering for sin, He will have many descendants. He will enjoy a long life, and the Lord's good plan will prosper in His hands. When He sees all that is accomplished by His anguish, He will be satisfied. And because of His experience, my righteous servant will make it possible for many to be counted righteous, for He will bear all their sins. I will give Him the honors of a victorious soldier, because He exposed himself to death.

# Every one of our lives would be changed if we just considered the sayings of Jesus and ask "What did Jesus say on the cross?" Here are some takeaways from the sayings of Jesus on the cross that if applied to your own life could change you forever!

### "Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do" (Luke 23:34)

Jesus lead by example in both forgiving and praying for your enemies. Jesus makes a statement that can humble us all. He was betrayed. He was beaten and spit on. The Roman Guards gambled for His belongings as He suffered. When it seemed like the world was against Him (it was), His heart was to request this one thing. What did Jesus say on the cross about those who would persecute Him?

Forgive them. How many of us hold grudges for lesser offenses? Some of us neglect to talk to old friends and family members because of past hurts. But the example of Jesus is one for us all to consider. Jesus, the Son of God, being whipped, scourged, and humiliated, chose forgiveness. What if we too choose forgiveness? Unforgiveness is often a greater punishment to ourselves than it is for the very people against whom we are holding a grudge.

Forgiveness doesn't always mean letting a person have influence in your life. But understand, unforgiveness is a detriment to your destiny. It holds you back. Forgiveness can be broken down into these 2 actions:

- 1. Giving the pain over to God and asking Him to intercede on behalf of the person that hurt you.
- 2. Deciding to continue with the purpose that God has for your life uninhibited by ill feelings toward a person or group of people.

It's easier said than done. But once accomplished, you'll be free. Will you be bold enough to let go and even ask God to help those that hurt you? Consider, what did Jesus say on the cross? In His toughest moments, He not only chose forgiveness but in an act of prayer asked that they would also have reconciliation with God.

Can you forgiven those who have persecuted you?

## "Today you will be with me in paradise" (Luke 23:43)

Many of us have heard this account. Jesus wasn't the only man condemned to die that fateful day. To both, His left and right were thieves that were also to be executed. One thief mocks Jesus and challenges Him as to whether or not He was the Messiah. The other criminal, however, makes a heartfelt statement on behalf of Jesus. The criminal takes 3 crucial steps in the life of any follower of Jesus. First, he has a reverence for God (Healthy fear and respect). Next, he acknowledges his own faults and imperfect nature. The criminal then takes the final step toward his salvation and that is confessing Jesus as Lord.

"Then he said, "Jesus", remember me when you come into your Kingdom." Luke 40:42

He makes a way for all who call on His Name.

Will you be like that thief and make a decision today to say "I want to be with you, Jesus"?

### "Woman, behold your son" (John 19:26-27)

Jesus cared deeply for His family and putting God's will first. In the Gospel of the Apostle John, we see a moment where Jesus looks down at two people He loved very much throughout His time here on earth. The Savior gazes upon John and His beloved mother. He appoints his disciple with a very honorable task. When Jesus saw His mother there, and the disciple whom He loved standing nearby, He said to her, "Woman, here is your son," and to the disciple, "Here is your mother." From that time on, this disciple took her into his home. John 19:26-27

When it gets tough, are you willing to focus on caring for those around you and following the will of God?

## "My God, My God, why have You forsaken Me" (Matthew 27:46)

At his most difficult moment, Jesus turned His attention toward Heaven. He cried out not with complaints, but with a song of praise. There is great evidence that this was not a cry of separation but actually a song of worship. Many believe that the most accurate interpretation of this saying of Jesus on the cross is that He was quoting straight out of the sacred hymns of the psalms.

Can you praise God and remember that He is faithful to His children, even in your toughest moments?

#### "I thirst" (John 19:28)

What did Jesus say on the cross that also captures the essence of both His humanity and His suffering? Jesus said, "I thirst." These two humble, yet powerful words are a stark reminder that what our Lord endured was very real. Jesus suffered for the greater good.

Are you willing to go through discomfort to accomplish what God has for your life?

## "It is finished" (John 19:30)

This single statement signifies the fulfillment of all the promises of God. The 6th statement that Jesus said on the cross is one that every believer can stand on for confidence in their walk with God. Jesus bore the sentence of all of our sins. "It is finished" is more than a saying, it is a battle cry for every Christian. The wages of sin may be death, but with the sacrifice of Jesus, we have life and have it with abundance! We no longer need to fear death.

Jesus followed through to complete His mission. So many quit short of our victory.

Are you willing to finish what you start for Jesus?

## "Father, into Your Hands I commit my Spirit" (Luke 23:46)

This final exclamation can only be summed up by one word. That word is "willingness". Jesus was willing to die and gave of Himself when He could have made a different decision. Consider what he told the Apostle Peter and also Pontius Pilate. Jesus said to Peter upon His arrest:

"Do you think I cannot call on My Father, and He will at once put at my disposal more than twelve legions of angels? But how then would the Scriptures be fulfilled that say

it must happen in this way?"

**Matthew 26:53** 

Jesus willingly gave His life for us.

Is it time to put your life completely into the Hands of God? Ultimately, what did Jesus say on the cross? He said, "I love you!"

If you would like to make a decision to follow Him, like the thief on the cross, all you have to do is say "Jesus, You are Lord. Take me with you."






