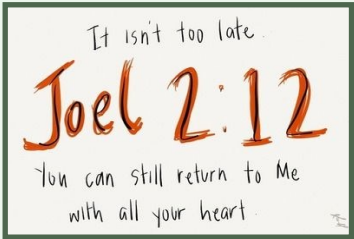

What is Annie Armstrong Easter Offering?

The offering was started in 1895 by the Woman's Missionary Union to benefit the work of the Home Mission Board (North American Mission Board). It was named in 1934 in honor of Annie Armstrong, a bold missions about advocate and WMU's first national executive leader. Annie was one that did not conform to the standards of her time. She served and challenged churches to action and rallied support for missionaries. She advocated for Native Americans and impoverished mountain people and gained support for the African American female missionaries. Annie was recognized as a national Southern Baptist trailblazer renowned for visionary mission leadership. That changed a lot of people's lives along the way and is still doing it today through the Annie Armstrong Easter Offering. All gifts are 100% in support of the missionaries and missions that are local and around our country.

This year our goal for First Baptist Church is \$3,000. The week of Prayer is March 5-12th. Look for flyers and envelopes in the annex or by the church office. March 5th—Second Sunday of Lent
Matthew 17: 1-9
The Transfiguration

Each year on the first Sunday of Lent, our Gospel tells the story of Jesus' temptation in the desert and on the second Sunday of Lent we move from Jesus' retreat to the desert we hear the story of Jesus' transfiguration. Jesus took Peter, James and John his brother, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. And he was transfigured before them; his face shown like the sun and his clothes became white as light. And behold, Moses and Elijah appeared to them, conversing with him. A bright white cloud overshadowed them and behold a voice out of the cloud said, "This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased, hear ye him. The disciples fell on their face and were afraid. Jesus came to them and said, **"Arise, and be not afraid."** They came down from the mountain and Jesus said, **"Tell the vision to no man, until the Son of man be risen again from the dead."**

March 12th -Third Sunday of Lent
John 2: 13-25
The Cleansing of the Temple

Since the Passover of the Jews was near, Jesus went up to Jerusalem. He found in the temple area those who sold oxen, sheep, and doves, as well as the money changers seated there. He made a whip out of cords and drove them all out of the temple area, with the sheep and oxen and spilled the coins of the money changers and overturned the tables, and to those who sold doves he said, **"Take these things hence, make not my Father's house a house of merchandise."** And the disciples remembered that it was written, The zeal of thine house hath eaten me up. At this time the Jews answered and said until him, "What sign showest thou into us, seeing that thou doest these things?" Jesus answered and said unto them. **"Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up."** The Jews said, "This temple has been under construction for forty six years and you will raise it up in three days?" But he was speaking about the temple of his body. Therefore, when he was raised from the dead, his disciples remember that he had said this, and they came to believe the Scripture and the word Jesus had spoken. While he was in Jerusalem for the feast of Passover, many began to believe in his name, when they saw the miracles which he did. But Jesus would not trust himself to them because he knew all men and did not need anyone to testify of man for he knew what was in man.

**March 19th—Fourth Sunday of Lent
John 3:14-15 Reason to Rejoice**

The fourth Sunday of Lent is traditionally known as “Laetare” (Rejoice) Sunday. Today’s Gospel describes the reason for our joy: God’s great love for us has been revealed in Jesus. We rejoice because we who look to Jesus have received healing for our broken spirits. And we believe that if we live by the kind of love Jesus shows us from the cross, we too can be life-giving for a broken and suffering world. We are called to mirror what we see in Jesus’ life, death and resurrection—and we hope that those who are just as broken can look to us to find help and healing. Through his Passion, Death, and Resurrection, Christ has reconciled us with God and one another.

John 3:14-15

“Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life.” For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life.

**March 26th—Fifth Sunday of Lent
John 11:17-44
Lazarus**

The raising of Lazarus shows the fullness of who Jesus is in his humanity and in his divinity. He shows deep compassion for Mary and Martha on the loss of their brother. And this grief touches his own heart and he weeps openly. He wants to do something. His prayer to his Father precedes the resuscitation of Lazarus. And when Lazarus comes from the tomb, Jesus commands those around to unbind him and set him free.

When Jesus arrived in Bethany, he found that Lazarus had already been in the tomb for four days. When Martha heard that Jesus was coming she went to meet him; but Mary sat at home. Martha said to Jesus, “Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died. But even now I know that whatever you ask of God, God will give you.” Jesus said to her, **“Your brother will rise.”** Martha said to him, “I know he will rise, in the resurrection on the last day.” Jesus told her, **“I am the resurrection and the life, whoever believes in me even if he dies, will live and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?”** She said to him, “Yes, Lord, I have come to believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God, the one who is coming into the world.” Jesus talked to Mary and said, **“Where have you laid him?”**

They told the Lord to come and see and Jesus wept. Jesus reached the tomb. Jesus said, **“Take away the stone.”** Martha told Him this is the fourth day and he will smell. Jesus replied, **“Have I not told you that if you believe, you will see the glory of God.”** So they took away the stone. Then Jesus lifted up his eyes and said, **“Father, I thank you for hearing my prayer, I know indeed that you always hear me, but I speak for the sake of all those who stand around me so they may believe that it was you who sent me.”** When he had said this, he cried out in a loud voice, **“Lazarus, here. Come out!”** The dead man came out. Jesus said to them, **“Unbind him, and let him go free.”**

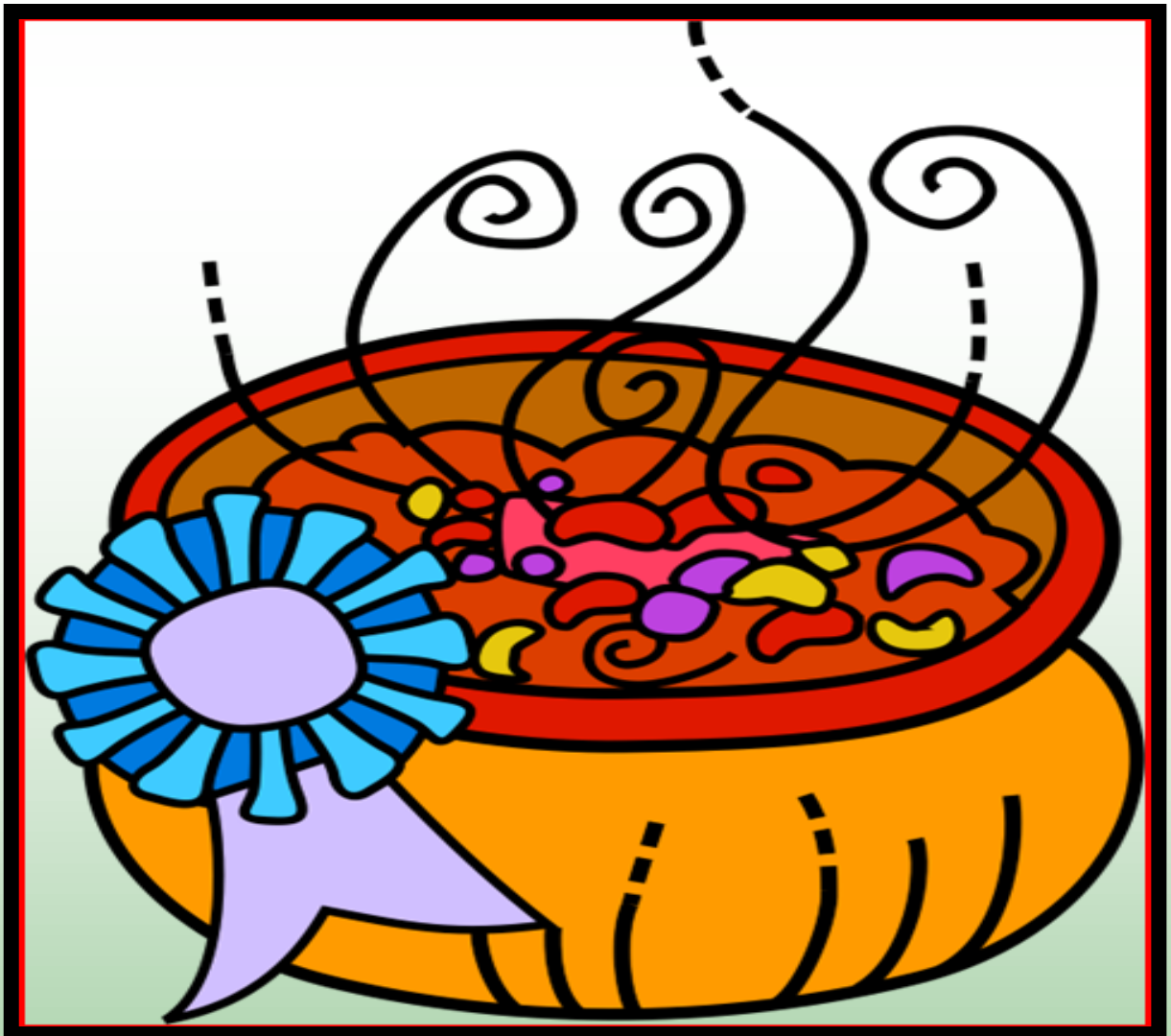

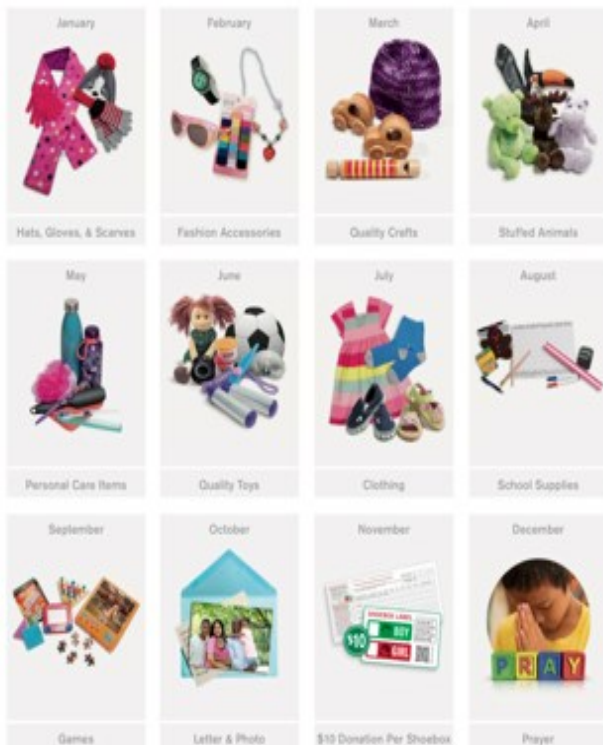

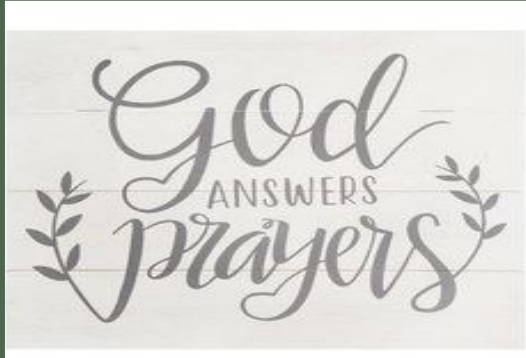
