

Love is mentioned many times throughout the Bible with one of the most endearing verses taken from 1 Corinthians 13: And now these three remain faith, hope, and love. But the greatest of these is love. I have loved thee with an everlasting love. Jeremiah 31:3 Our loving God is love and loves all. I John 4:8: He that loveth not knoweth not God; for God is love.

There are different types of love.

Ahab (Deep Emotional Love) -Also Know As Storge Love Ahava/Ahab is the Hebrew word for love and describes an intense emotional bond, a strong connection. This is the affection & love between family members. Eros Love is a Romantic Love Between Married People.

Hesed (Steadfast Love)

This Hebrew word is often translated as lovingkindness or mercy, faithfulness, and dedication. Hesed is not just a feeling , but an action. In human relationships, hesed implies loving our neighbor, not merely in terms of warm emotional feelings but in acts of love and service. Hesed is an unchanging, loyal love.

Agape (Unconditional Universal Love)

Agape is considered the best Greek word for God's love. This word means to show honor, affection, kindness, and goodness, not because of a deep emotional connection but rather out of integrity. Agape love shows love regardless if it is reciprocal or not. It is unconditional love, undeserved by the receiver. Agape love is the love God has for us. This is the highest form of love. This is the love that Jesus commands us to have for God and one another. Jesus replied, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all

your soul and with all your mind." This is the first and greatest commandment and

the second is like unto it, "Love your neighbor as yourself" (Matthew 22:37-39). No matter what a person does to us, we must choose to love them. No matter the circumstances we must continue to love God in the good times and the bad. Agape love isn't based on your emotions or the person but choosing to love no matter what!

Philia (Friendly Love)

Do you know why the city of Philadelphia is called "the city of brotherly love?" Philadelphia is a combination of two Greek words that mean "love" and "brother". The Greek word philia means familial love. Philia is the type of love that involves friendship and a love without romantic attraction and is referred to as "brotherly love." Be kindly affectioned one to another with brotherly love; in honour preferring one another. Romans 12:10

The final disposition selection of how you want your remains cared for is a personal choice that should be shared with loved ones in advance of the time of need.

The body is a temporary dwelling place for both our soul and our spirit.

Some worry that something that is done to their physical bodies will somehow effect their eternal destination.

A related concern is what happens to believers whose bodies were destroyed in some tragic and unintended way,

such as in war, or by fire, or through drowning at sea. Our spirit lives forever and is that portion of us that has fellowship with God who will have no trouble resurrecting our bodies no matter how we die or the final disposition choice we make. Our resurrection body will be a different body than our earthly one. The Apostle Paul makes this clear in First Corinthians 15:35-53. Scripture does not give us specific guidance as to a preferred method of burial, leading each individual to prayerfully make that choice.

The weekday program exists as a community outreach ministry of First Baptist Church.



First Baptist Church , the Preschool Director, and it's staff comply with required rules and regulations of the Virginia Department of Social Services regarding staffing, procedures, and facility.




